UrbanPromise hires certified teachers to deliver our summer literacy curriculum. Teaching with UrbanPromise is an ideal opportunity for current or former educators with a deep passion for helping our elementary school students build the literacy skills they need to become leaders in their classrooms and in their communities. This is a seasonal position that will begin the week of June 17th and end July 26th.

Essential Job Functions

Responsibilities of an Summer Elementary Literacy Teacher include but are not limited to:

- Implement literacy curricula and activities.
- Develop engaging lesson plans aligned to specific learning objectives.
- Deliver engaging and rigorous lesson plans that appeal to all learners.
- Use formal assessment data to inform planning and delivery of lessons.
- Create a positive, achievement-oriented, engaging, and structured environment that excites and invests children.
- Motivate children to realize academic growth and character development.
- Communicate effectively with students, families (occasionally), and UrbanPromise staff.
- Meet regularly with the Literacy Coordinator and/or the Executive Director to establish goals, measure effectiveness, and work to continually improve programs.
